This information sheet is designed to give details about small grants, which are available for small groups and organisations within the voluntary sector in **Cardiff**. The entries in this sheet are intended as a general guide, the contacts given will be able to provide you with more detailed information.

This sheet should be read in conjunction with **7.4.1 Small Grants** which details small grants which are available on a regional or all Wales basis.

Ageing Well Grant Scheme

Aim: This grant is funded by Cardiff Local Health Board and Cardiff Council and supports activities that improve health and wellbeing of people aged 50+.

Who can apply? Voluntary sector organisations which support and benefit older people in Cardiff.

What can it fund?

- Capital costs
- Activity costs (transport, events, postage)
- Volunteer development.

How much? Grants range from £50 to £500.

Deadline: The closing date for this financial year is Friday 30th January 2009. However Age Concern expect this to be an ongoing scheme.

Aim: The George Hill-Snook Charity for the Aged, funds practical one off items for individual people over 60 who are Cardiff residents.

Who can apply? The application form must be completed by a sponsor organisation acting on behalf of the applicant and with their expressed consent.

What can it fund?

- Items such as fridges, washing machines, cookers, beds, bedding and essential clothing & furniture
- Household repairs and security fittings
- Disability aids and minor adaptations and repairs

How much? Although there is no specified maximum amount this is a small grant scheme and funds are restricted.

Deadline: Completed application forms need to be submitted by the first of every month.

Aim: To support activities that benefit children and young people in South Wales who are experiencing poverty and/or disadvantage, are experiencing abuse, neglect, homelessness, violence or crime, or have an illness or disability.

Who can apply? Community groups and registered organisations (not individuals) living in the broadcast area of Red Dragon.

What can it fund?

- Capital projects
- Residential UK trips
- Educational or play equipment

Impact + Grant Scheme (Voluntary Action Cardiff)

Aims: IMPACT+ is a small capital grant scheme, which funds capital items only to help community and voluntary organisations in Cardiff provide new, better or expanded services and activities for the benefit of communities in Cardiff.

Who can apply? Applicants must:

- be voluntary and community organisations based in Cardiff and/or working for the benefit of Cardiff
- have a governing document, relevant policies and a bank account

What can it fund? Impact + can only fund capital (equipment) costs. It cannot fund building works, refurbishment and funding towards new buildings.

How much?

The scheme operates on 2 levels:

Level 1 is for grants of up to £1,000 for organisations based anywhere in Cardiff.

Level 2 is for grants of between £1,000 and £5,000 and is for groups based in disadvantaged areas in Cardiff and/or who work with disadvantaged communities.

Deadline: Quarterly deadlines apply.

Memory Lane Cakes Grant Scheme

Aim: This scheme was set up to support community organisations and voluntary groups. This fund relies on the Memory Lane Cakes company donating funds which are then distributed by the Community Foundation in Wales who run the grant scheme. Community Foundation in Wales are expecting this fund to continue, however it depends on donations received.

Who can apply? Constituted voluntary groups and registered charities. (Not individuals, statutory organisations or groups with large reserves).

What can it fund?

- Activities and running costs
- Building alterations
- Publicity material
- Minor capital costs (not laptop computers).

How much? £1,000

Deadline: Funding for this scheme is yet to be confirmed for the 2008/2009 financial year. However this is expected to be an ongoing scheme.

What can it fund? Activities and facilities for young people across South Wales.

How much? Up to £750.

St David's 2 Community Fund

Aims: 'St David's 2' is an exciting new development coming to the Capital City of Wales. Once open in 2009, the development will enhance the existing shopping and city living in Cardiff. The St David's Partnership have introduced a Community Fund of up to £500.

Who can apply? Grants are available to local groups to assist in the staging of events in Cardiff which enhance the community's quality of life.

What can it fund? Local community events i.e. fete, music festival, art show, sports tournament, concerts, carnival or any other community initiative.

How much? Each individual grant is worth £500. Individuals and groups can apply for grants to cover the total cost of the event, up to a maximum of £2000. To make an application for £2000 you must be able to show why your cause should receive all four of the £500 grants offered.

- Be a voluntary organisation
- Have a recognised legal and constitutional status
- Be independent of the statutory and private sectors
- Be legally able to undertake activities in Cardiff
- Have aims and objectives in keeping with the activities funded under the grant scheme and objectives of the Council
- Have a clear management structure
- Have a bank account
- Have clear financial controls
- Have clear policies

Deadlines: Cardiff Council grant schemes are generally circulated in September/October for consideration in advance of the next financial year. The smaller grants schemes are ongoing. Please check with the named officer.
