## 7. Finding and getting money

### 7.4.13 Local funding - Wrexham

This information sheet is designed to give details about small grants, which are available for small groups and organisations within the voluntary sector in Wrexham. The entries in this sheet are intended as a general guide, the contacts given will be able to provide you with more detailed information.

This sheet should be read in conjunction with **7.4.1 Small Grants** which details small grants which are available on a regional or all Wales basis.

### **Wrexham Community Facilities and Activities Programme**

The Wrexham Community Facilities and Activities Programme helps community and voluntary organisations provide facilities or carry out activities which will promote the regeneration of communities.

Funding is available for capital only schemes such as: creating new facilities, refurbishment of existing facilities, providing toilets for the disabled, providing access for the disabled, improvements to built or natural environment, equipment provided for community/social economy businesses.

The grants scheme is open to voluntary groups, community groups or charities in the County Borough of Wrexham providing they:

- Have a constitution or set of rules that have been signed or “adopted”.
- Have an equal opportunities policy.
- Have a bank or building society account.
- Have annual accounts (audited or signed as approved by a senior person from the group).

The grants scheme will provide grants up to a maximum of £4,000 per application. Applications are assessed 3 times a year, by an independent local panel.

## **Sports Wales -Community Chest Grant**

Community Chest is a Sports Wales, initiative that provides funding for community sport and physical activity. Under new guidelines, the maximum grant awarded has been increased to £1,500.

## **Communities First Trust Fund**

The Communities First Trust Fund (CFTF) aims to support any type of activity that involves local people, through small community organisations, that benefits their community. Applications are welcome from a range of community projects including music and the arts. The activities must provide some measure of economic, environmental, social or cultural benefit for people living in a Communities First area. There is no minimum amount but £5,000 is the maximum that can be applied for. Applications can be submitted to the CFTF until 30 November 2011 and are processed on a first come first served basis.

Eligible wards within Wrexham area are: Plas Madoc, Queensway, Hermitage 2, Caia Park and Gwenfro.

### **WREN Small Grants Scheme**

£2,000 - £15,000

This is a new funding stream and the fund is aimed at smaller projects, the total value of the project must be no more than £50,000.

All WREN applications are reviewed by local volunteer Advisory Panels who know the needs and requirements of your area and have regional knowledge.

## **Welsh Church Acts Fund**

This annual fund is used to provide financial assistance for charitable purposes to organisations operating within the Wrexham County Borough area, and priority will be given to organisations supporting:

- Social and Recreational Facilities
- Places of Worship and Burial Grounds
- Blind Persons and Elderly Persons

Grants are given for items of lasting benefit, to properly constituted organisations; Applicants, who have received grants within the last two years, are unlikely to be successful. Grants are not available for running costs, general appeals or to meet applications rejected due to council budget constraints. The maximum amount of award available is £500, and the closing date for applications is 31st July each year.

## Coalfields Regeneration Trust

The Coalfields Regeneration Trust supports organizations working to improve the quality of life within coalfield communities. Its aim is to make coalfields sustainable and to work towards the point where they can be prosperous, viable and cohesive without support. Their support areas are:

- Access to Employment, projects connecting people to mainstream opportunities rather than job creation.
- Education and Skills, projects providing added value and filling gaps, not statutory mainstream provision.
- Health and Wellbeing, preventative measures and healthy lifestyle support.
- Access to Opportunities, equality of access to services and local transport issues.

They have two grant schemes both within the above priority areas:

**Main Grants.** Grants range between £300 and £300,000 and can be for both capital and revenue purposes, including salaries. They will fund projects for up to three years.

**Bridging the Gap** Grants of between £500 and £10,000 are available, but projects must be completed within 12 months. Eligible activities could be: developing or improving organisations or groups; developing or improving an existing activity, facility or service; and developing a new activity, facility or service.

Both Main Grants and Bridging the Gap funding can cover up to 100% of project funding. Applicants must be either located in, or benefit the communities in the following Wrexham Maelor wards of: Minera, Penycae, Ponciau, Esclusham, including Rhostyllen, Bersham, Aberoer, Legacy, Pentre Bychan, and Branwylfa.

## Clwyd Community Chest

Denbighshire Voluntary Services Council (DVSC) administers the "Community Chest" grants and loans scheme for voluntary and community groups operating within the former County of Clwyd.

Grants of up to £250 and loans of up to £2,000 are made to organisations or groups [who are registered charities or undertake charitable objectives] who work with:

- Older people
- People with a physical disability
- People with learning disabilities
- People with mental health problems
- Children at a disadvantage

- Play and recreation facilities for children
- Unemployed people who undertake voluntary work
- Village hall maintenance
- Environmental activities
- Cultural activities

### **Cymorth Sustainability Grant**

Funding is available to set up, sustain or expand good quality childcare provision in Wrexham County Borough.

Childminders, Out of School Clubs, Playgroups including Playgroup Plus and Private Day Nurseries are eligible to apply.

Grants can be used for

- Health and safety requirements to meet the C.S.S.I.W. National Minimum Standards
- Revenue costs e.g. wages, rent, utility bills
- Training which is required to continue working with children
- Equipment which both enhances the child's experience in a setting and promotes the inclusion of children with special needs.

Grant amounts awarded are not likely to exceed £400. Priority will be given to childcare settings in Community First Areas or other areas where settings meet a community need and are at severe risk of closure.

## The Cemex Community Fund

The Cemex Community Fund provides grants from the Landfill Communities Fund, for projects that provide and maintain community facilities and amenities within the vicinity of a CEMEX site. Grants of between £1,000 and £15,000 are available for projects which:

- Provide and maintain public parks and amenities when the work protects the social, built and/or natural environment
- Repair or restore buildings or structures which are of religious, historical or architectural interest

There is a two-stage application process, and applications are considered quarterly. Priority is given to projects within a three-mile radius of CEMEX quarry and landfill sites. Their two sites within the Wrexham area are: Wrexham Plant, Rhosddu Industrial Estate, and Ballswood Quarry, Gegin Lane, Llay.

## Village Halls Grant Fund

The Wrexham County Borough Council, Grants for Village Halls fund, is an annual fund with a total budget of £17,500 for 2009/10. Grants of between £250 and the maximum of £2,500 can be used for equipment, building repairs and items of lasting benefit (e.g. energy saving measures). The awards cannot be made to cover staffing costs or general appeals/sponsorship.

Applications must be submitted by properly constituted management committees/trustees administering village halls within Wrexham County Borough. Town or Village Halls operated by Community Councils are eligible to apply. Church Halls and other meeting places will be considered, providing that there is no other village hall or community centre within that community. In all cases, the appropriate application form should be completed. Applications to the 2009/10 Fund should be submitted by the deadline of 5 June 2009. Only one award will be made to each organisation.

## **Cory Environmental Trust**

The Cory Environmental Trust distributes grants under LCF Objectives D, DA and E:

- Objective D: Improvement to community amenities or facilities, for a recreational or leisure activity. E.g. play areas, village halls, public parks, nature reserves, skate parks, visitor centres etc. Facilities must be fully accessible to the public.
- Objective DA: For the conservation of identified species or habitats that, are detailed in a Biodiversity Action Plan.
- Objective E: To maintain, repair or restore places of religious worship, or listed historical buildings or structures.

Projects must be based within 10 miles of the Hafod Landfill site, Johnstown. Eligible applicants can be charities, voluntary and community groups, environmental organisations, constituted not-for-private-profit organisations, local authorities and even government bodies.

## **West Wrexham Small Grants Scheme**

The West Wrexham Small Grant Scheme is aimed at small community groups with projects that bring local people together and enable them to take part in community activities. The grants of up to £250 can be used for a wide variety of purposes, such as: new equipment, running costs, room hire, publicity and promotion, putting on events, setting up new groups, small repairs to a community venue, even for match funding to draw down larger grants from alternative sources.

## Moving On Wrexham

Moving On Wrexham awards one-off grants to support individual young people in progressing in work, education, training or volunteering within Wrexham County Borough. Grants of up to £250 are available for young people in need, to purchase items which will help overcome barriers to their progression, such: as clothing for interviews, training resources, equipment, books and study materials.

Priority will be given to applications from young people aged 16 to 19, who are:

- Unemployed
- Offenders
- Homeless/vulnerably housed
- Lone parents

Applicants must be either living in Wrexham County Borough, or employed/participating in either: training, volunteering, attending school or college within Wrexham county Borough. Moving On Wrexham grants will be paid either by store vouchers which can be exchanged for goods at local stores; or by cheques to a nominated support worker in a voluntary organisation, college or training establishment. There is no deadline, however, funds are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis.
